Since that time, Presidents Bill Clinton, George W. Bush, and Barack Obama have continued the tradition. It has become a big White House event for the President to officially pardon the turkey when it’s presented to him.

What happens to the turkeys after they are pardoned? From 1989 to 2004, the turkeys were sent to a petting zoo called Kidwell Farm, at Frying Pan Park in Herndon, Virginia. Since 2005 the turkeys have been flown to Disneyland in California. They serve as the Grand Marshals for the Disneyland Thanksgiving Parade, and after that, they spend the rest of their lives at a Disneyland ranch.



On November 26, 2009, President Barack Obama officially pardons a Thanksgiving turkey.
